First impressions of the Polish capital are usually those of sentimental nature: strolls around the UNESCO-listed Old Town or the riverside Royal Castle gardens, Chopin recitals in kings' former summer residence, sweeping views from the 30th floor of the mysterious and emblematic Palace of Culture and Science...

DAY 1

1. Arrival to Warsaw

2. Hotel check-in

Warsaw offers a selection of boutique and historical hotels which will take you back to its romantic past. For the proximity of the Old Town choose one along the Royal Route – a representative tract between the Royal Castle and former kings' residences.

3. Walk around the Old Town

Meander the atmospheric cobbled lanes of Warsaw's colourful Old Town – a unique UNESCO World Heritage site which is also a home to a handful of insightful museums. Don't miss the grand **Royal Castle** with splendid gardens, Warsaw Uprising Monument or – having walked through the New Town market square – a light and music show at the Fountain Park.



4. Lunch

First meal in Warsaw should introduce you to the rich and tasty traditional Polish cuisine.

The peaceful garden of **Dawne Smaki** restaurant will be a perfect setting for your first culinary experience!

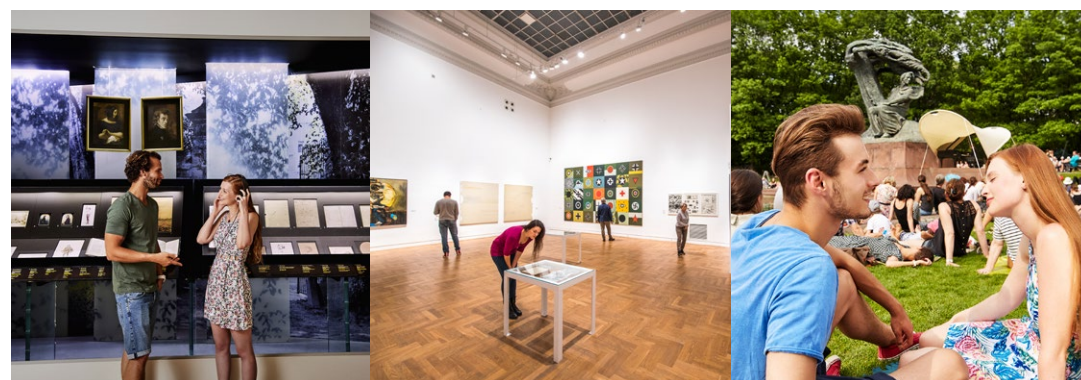
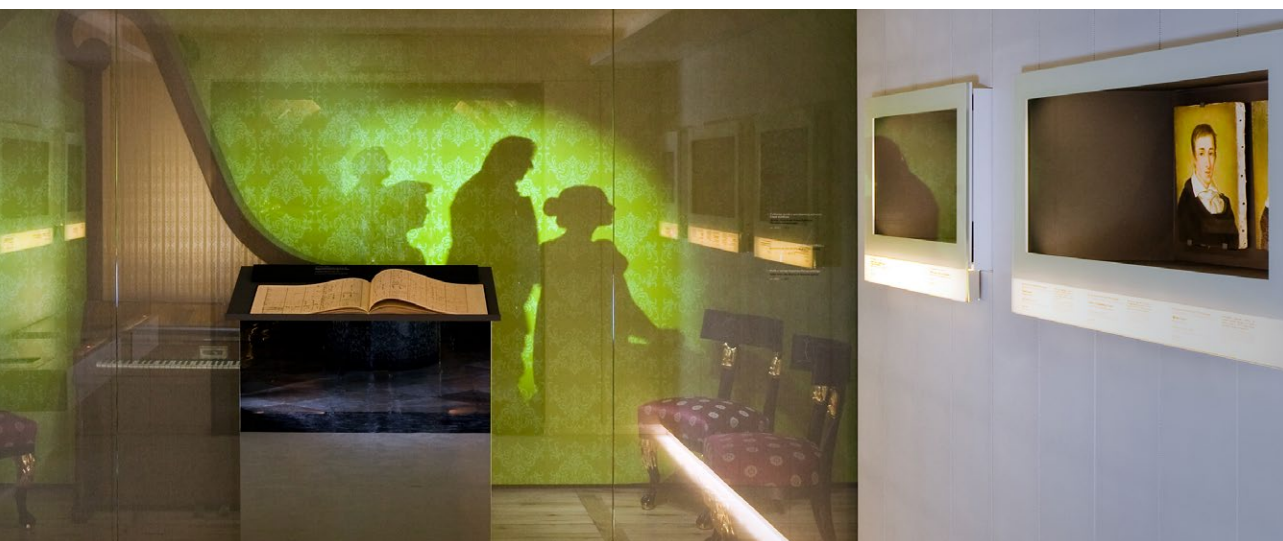
Day 1

5. Follow Chopin's footsteps – guided walk along the Royal Route and a visit to Chopin's Museum.

Discover the city through the eyes of one of the world's greatest composers. Visit the Holy Cross Church, where his heart is entombed and the **Fryderyk Chopin Museum** with the world's largest collection of Chopin memorabilia. Take a break on one of Chopin benches and enjoy his music with a single press of a button. Stroll around the calm Saxon Garden, watch the change of guards at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, admire the magnificent Grand Theatre & National Opera and catch up on art and culture at **Zachęta Gallery of Art**.

6. Chopin concert

Chopin music concert accompanied by a glass of sparkling wine in one of the venues near the Castle Square (**Fryderyk Concert Hall**, **Chopin Point**, **Time for Chopin**) will be a quintessential start of the first evening in Warsaw.

1. Breakfast

For a morning dose of coffee and freshly baked pastries head to one of the popular **Charlotte bistros** – each in a distinct location with plenty of history and local culture. Whether it's the buzz of the trendy Plac Zbawiciela, quiet atmosphere of the former Jewish quarter in Plac Grzybowski or modernised surroundings of the ex-communist party headquarters – it is bound to give you energy and inspiration for the rest of the day.

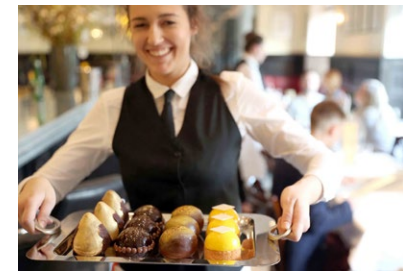

2. Explore Warsaw's top museums

Now you can satisfy your hunger for history in the fantastically informative **Warsaw Rising Museum** - a unique place which helps visitors understand contemporary Warsaw, which was completely destroyed during the Second World War, and the beautifully housed **Museum of the History of Polish Jews POLIN** - a thousand years of history told in a symbolic place brings back the memory of the rich culture and heritage of Polish Jews. Art lovers should definitely visit the **National Museum**, where you will find a unique collection of paintings, sculptures and crafts from all eras, from antiquity to the present day.

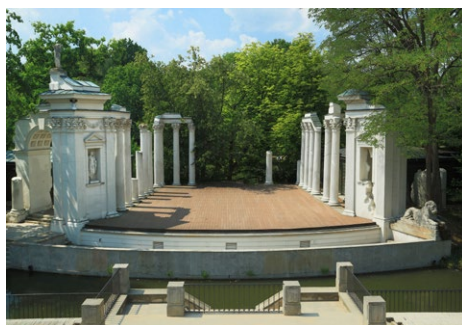
Day 3

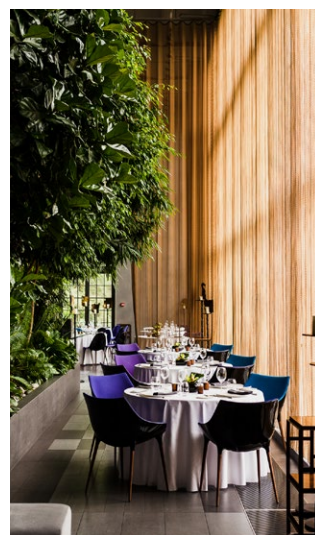


2. Lunch
